PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR 2024 TO WAGGAROOS AGM

Club Activities

WaggaRoos conducted 28 orienteering events during 2024; 3 score events as part of the 2023-24 Summer Series, 3 MapRuns as part of the 2024-25 Summer Series, 9 local bush events, 3 of the 6 event Interclub Challenge against Albury-Wodonga (which they won), 4 Learn to Orienteer sessions, and the Riverina Schools Orienteering Championships.

During the year 56 different people tried orienteering. Of those, 13 came orienteering 4 or more times, and 28 only came once.

The annual Training Weekend was conducted this year in the Wagga region and was well attended by WaggaRoos and AWOC members. A number of different fun activities were undertaken over the weekend all designed to hone various orienteering skills. The emphasis on Saturday was on practising various navigating skills particularly reading contours, while on Sunday the focus was on navigating in rock.

WaggaRoos again organised the Riverina Schools Orienteering Day. 122 entries were received, and 98 students from Riverina schools participated. The enthusiasm of the participants, their courtesy, and great weather all helped make this a wonderful day. Many thanks to Ron Pallas, Gayle Shepherd and Lyn Malmgron, who came from Sydney, and Peter Mousley, Rob Simmons and Hugh Cameron who came from Albury-Wodonga to help WaggaRoos with the conduct of the day. It was busy but ran remarkably smoothly. While all those who participated are considered winners, there were some great performances from WaggaRoo juniors:

Logan Seaman 1st B10-11 years Ryder Seaman 2nd B12-13 years

Subsequently, WaggaRoos was approached to organise a similar day for Home-Schooled children. 30 children between the ages of 6 and 17 years participated enthusiastically.

- Logan Seaman: M10 ACT Sprint Distance Champion; M10 NSW Middle Distance Champion; M10
 Australian-3-Day Champion; M10 Australian Long-Distance Champion; and 3rd in M10 at the
 Australian Middle-Distance Championships.
- Briohny Seaman: W21 NSW Long-Distance Champion; W21 NSW Sprint Champion; W40 Australian 3
 Day Champion; W40 Australian Middle-Distance Champion; W40 Australian Long-Distance
 Champion; 2nd in W21 ACT Long Distance Championship; and 2nd in W21 NSW Middle Distance
 Championship.

In the 2024 National Non-Elite rankings, WaggaRoos was one of 5 of the 14 NSW orienteering clubs, and one of 13 of the 57 orienteering clubs across Australia which had at least 3 club members in the first three places:

- Deb Davey was ranked 1st in W65;
- Briohny Seaman was ranked 1st in W40; and
- Logan Seaman was ranked 2nd in M10.

ONSW presented Kath Oliver with a *50 years of Orienteering Honour* in recognition of her long participation and contribution to orienteering.

Alex Davey was the Level 3 Controller for the 2024 Australian Middle-Distance Championships.

Membership

Membership has been declining for a number of years in a way that suggested that the club would disappear in 2024. However, things seem to have plateaued. In 2019 we had 36 members; in 2020 we had 26; in 2021 and 2022 we had 19; in 2023 we had 18, and in 2024 we have had a small increase to 23. To date in 2025 we have 13 members.

Committee Activities

The Committee met on 8 occasions during 2024. The principal activities for the Committee were

- the planning and conduct of the event program; and
- · responding to the administrative requirements of ONSW.

I again commend the way the Committee has managed the Club on your behalf and particularly thank Alex as Secretary, and Deb for managing the Treasury duties.
